CDSN is more than just a place to store your data!

AWQMS, our data management system, also offers data analysis tools where you can generate reports, graphs, and maps with your data. We also offer the 'CDSN Google-Map' to spatially explore data and exceedances.

By the Numbers

Over 62,300 results for 12 data partners were submitted to CDPHE for the most recent data calls for Regulations 32 and 36 in September 2021.

Over 180,000 results for 22 data partners were submitted to CDPHE for the most recent data calls for Regulations 34, 35, and 38.

Over 10,000 nutrient results for 25 organizations and 31 discharge permits were submitted to CDPHE for Regulation 85.

A Little Bit about the CDSN

CDSN is currently helping over 70 different data organizations manage, share, and analyze more than 5.2 million water results at over 25,000 monitoring locations throughout Colorado.

HOW THE CDSN WORKS

- 1. Become a data provider by contacting the CDSN.
- 2. For an hourly fee, CDSN experts will format your data and, upon approval, upload it to the Ambient Water Quality Monitoring System (AWQMS) and send it directly to the CDPHE, if needed, when Data Calls are made.
- 3. Once your data is formatted and uploaded, it will be stored with dozens of other data providers' data in AWQMS where it is available immediately and in the future.
- 4. Inside this shared system you have the ability to search, filter, map, chart, and graph your own data in conjunction with other provider's data...what a great way to make informed water management decisions!
- 5. Your data will also be available in the CDSN Monitoring Sites & Exceedances App and the ArcGIS webmap. AND, if your data is uploaded to EPA's Water Quality Exchange, then it will also be available in eRAM's Watershed Rapid Assessment Program (WRAP) tool.
- 6. Sit back and relax knowing that your hard-earned data are safely stored in a system that is accessible when you need it!
