Meeting Minutes

1. WELCOME, CALL TO ORDER

2. DISCUSSION AND APPROVAL OF PAST MONTH'S MEETING MINUTES - The attendance table at end had Tim Steele's business name incorrect, corrected to TDS Consulting. Motion to approve April's Meeting Minutes was made by Linda Chynoweth and seconded by Diane Kielty.

3. DISCUSSION ON MEETING MINUTES FORMAT – After discussion of researched information on minutes it was decided that it is best to have a high level, succinct information in minutes. Reviewing of the minutes will be done only by those who attend the conference call and then final meeting minutes will be sent out to the entire group afterwards. For simplicity the meeting minutes will not be posted on the webpage, however they can be requested at any time.

4. FINANCIAL REPORT - Current Balance as of May's conference call was \$8436.22. Bob and Casey will be discussing receivables and payables for budget tracking.

5. CDSN CONTRACTOR (LYNN) OR UPDATE FROM PRESIDENT – Notes from contractor:

- Redesigned and deployed www.ColoradoWaterData.org website and incorporated CWQMC information into a dedicated section of it.
 - Updates of the GIS apps planned to incorporate all of the updated and new monitoring locations are planned this spring (all RiverWatch monitoring locations were updated in the last 6 months). Around 2100 monitoring locations have had been updated or added to AWQMS since the last GIS update in 2016.
 - Provided technical assistance for data calls and related efforts to more than 20 organizations and entities, including but not limited to: CDPHE, CWQMC, Gold Systems, Brown & Caldwell, Poudre Alliance, MWRD, Denver Dept. of Environmental Health, Colorado Mtn College, Colorado River Watch, Clear Creek Watershed, and AFCURE and SPCURE organizations, etc.
- Submitted REG38 data for 682 monitoring locations/213,390 results in 6 submission packages to CDPHE for the REG38/93 Data Call (one submission package for each uploading entity):
 - Submitted REG85 data for 97 monitoring locations/9,963 results in 6 submission packages to CDPHE for the Nutrients program (one submission package for each uploading entity).

- Invoiced 7 Fee-For-Service (FFS) clients payable to CWA between 3/11 and 4/19.
 - Created 9 invoices (7 FFS and 2 admin) payable to contractor between 3/11 and 4/19.
Contractor still waiting to receive payment from CWA for three invoices submitted on 4/15 and 4/19.

6. UPDATES

- In person meeting to be scheduled with Colorado Monitoring Framework? - Pending
- 2019 CWQMC/CDSN contributions? Update; what still needs to be completed? – Donation invoices were sent out by email on May 14, 2019. All entities had been contacted and their information and support confirmed.
- Casey informed us that the River Network has been reaching out for assistance and/or lessons learned on developing a national database for WQ. Casey thought it might be in the Council best interest to contact River Network to see what they are doing. – Appears that they want to know how to access data on the CDSN, we need to let them know that CDSN has web services available to acquire the CDSN data, assistance is always available.
- Discussion of Phil's thoughts lead to perhaps a One Water Solution Institute may have a desktop that performs with watersheds delineated and a measuring tool. – Tabled for this call.

7. NEW BUSINESS

- City of Fort Collins would like to meet to discuss CDSN and donations.
- Bob will continue to work with Tyler to have CDSN data available with OWSI products.
- Jordan assisted Wendy Warner with CUSP to get the CUSP data uploaded into CDSN. The amount of meta data and minimum data requirements was not as easily found as expected. How to make this easier for data uploads?
- Jordan will be developing a fact sheet on how to retrieve data from CDSN for SPURWP's Science & Data Sub-Committee. Diane wondered if a CWA workshop would be good for SPURWP and Jordan agreed to check with that group for interest.
- May 1, 2019 follow-up with the Purgatoire Watershed group was very positive and additional work with the group will look at grant opportunities to move future work forward.
- Bob talked about CWA's new Facebook and how nice it is to get that information.
